# ATREUS

The name Atreus comes from Greek mythology and represents a brave warrior. It is fitting for two-year-old Atreus who surprised his parents nearly three months before his due date. "He kind of came as a surprise," explains his mom, Haly. "I had no signs of being pregnant with him. I went into the ER for stomach pains and they told me I was pregnant. Moments later, I gave birth in the ER. Atreus is the perfect name for him. He is quite the little warrior."

Being premature led to an extended stay in the NICU for Atreus. He had some medical concerns, needing oxygen and a feeding tube for many months. He overall had low muscle tone, but with the help of occupational therapy (OT) and physical therapy (PT), Atreus is thriving.

"We are working on helping Atreus meet his age-appropriate milestones. Basically, most of what we need to address stems from him being premature," explains Mary, his occupational therapist. "I focus on fine motor coordination and dexterity – activities that require both hands to manipulate toys. So, we do a lot of pushing buttons, twisting knobs, turning pages of a book. While Erika, his physical therapist, is focusing on getting Atreus in good positioning for all those activities. Essentially, I work on the upper extremities while PT works on building strength and teaching proper positioning in his lower extremities to help support him through all these activities." There is a lot of coordination between his therapists. They work together to create a plan that helps address what Atreus needs to focus on to keep progressing.

**Atreus' parents have noticed that he is making great strides with the help of Curative. "Because of his therapy, Atreus is climbing more, supporting himself when he sits on the floor. He is even crawling a lot faster," adds Haly.**

"They showed us a lot of exercises we can do with him. PT is even working on getting a gait trainer for Atreus to give him more mobility and help him navigate his environment better."

"Atreus is very chill and laid back, but he has a very goofy side to him. He loves his books and stuffed animals," adds Haly. "Actually, he has just been amazing. We were not expecting kids so soon, but he came and made everything better. And, Curative has been so amazing in helping us with everything. They are great people, really nice and they just love Atreus. I would tell other parents in the same situation to have a lot of patience," concludes Haly. "It is going to get better and your child will progress. They are just going to take their own time to develop on their own schedule."



## WHAT DOES BIRTH TO THREE SERVICES OFFER?

Birth to Three Services are offered to children with developmental delays or disabilities and include physical, occupational and speech therapy, early childhood education and family service coordination.

It has long been the provider of choice with experts in all areas of child development including movement, speech and sensory processing.

# STELLA

Stella is a spunky six-year-old who just started first grade. Like many six-year-olds, Stella enjoys reading and music, likes to laugh and loves her two younger sisters – Charlie (4) and Madelyn (1). Stella was born with a rare genetic condition and has been participating in physical, occupational and speech therapy since birth.

“Her therapy has focused on helping Stella be able to tolerate stimulation from the environment around her, so she can do things that many six-year-olds take for granted, like simply riding in a car on a sunny day,” explains Mary, Stella’s occupational therapist.

“Stella had vestibular issues where any kind of movement makes her uncomfortable,” explains Stella’s dad, Steve. “I remember initially taking her to therapy and they would have her sit on a swing and move ever so slightly in one direction to get her comfortable with movement. Thanks to her team at Curative New Berlin Therapies (CNBT), her progress has been amazing.”

**Stella’s mom, Sarah, is impressed with the communication between all of her therapists. “It is just very obvious that they are working together as one coordinated team for the well-being of Stella, which provides a much more seamless experience for us as a family.”**

Stella’s therapists even work with her school to make sure the support she gets at school aligns with what she is learning at CNBT. “Kelsea (Stella’s physical therapist) has coordinated with Stella’s school team on her IEP. And that is very helpful to us,” adds Sarah. “It is very hard as parents to know exactly what to communicate with the school. So, with their help, there is consistency at school and at home and at Curative – we are all working toward the same goals.”

‘Team Stella’ extends to her family, with her parents and even grandparents getting involved in her therapy. “Stella’s family is great,” adds Mary. “They are able to motivate her when she feels the challenges are too much, and they also place her into challenging situations in a supportive manner.”

“Curative gives us suggestions about games we can try at home to work on Stella’s dexterity, which has been really helpful,” explains Steve. “They have also clued us in to a lot of outside resources. They connected us with Katy’s Kloset, to help us get therapy equipment we might need. Kelsea even found us a connection to a three-wheel bike.”

The team effort has definitely paid off for Stella. She has made great strides since starting at CNBT. Sarah describes how you don’t always notice it in the day-to-day process of going to therapy, but then a memory pops up on her phone, and it will amaze them on how far Stella has come. “When she first started with physical therapy at Curative, Stella had a walker and she wasn’t bearing much weight on her feet,” adds Sarah. “And now she is working on independent standing and independent walking. It is pretty impressive!”

# SHAKUR "SJ"

Keeping up with a high-energy, five-year-old can be a challenge for any parent. But for Pri, her son Shakur, or SJ as she affectionately calls him, has level 3 Autism and a tendency to wander off and explore the world around him. This makes going to the park, or even taking a shower, a challenge for Pri. The minute she turns her back, SJ is off on another adventure.

Thanks to the help of Children's Long-Term Support (CLTS) at Curative Care, Pri has found resources to provide her peace of mind and keep SJ safe. Pri meets with Avery, their service coordinator, quarterly. He helps them find solutions to some of the parenting challenges she faces. "Avery is amazing. Whenever I need him, he is so responsive. If I am looking for something and he doesn't know about it, he gets back to me quickly."

Recently Avery helped Pri get a Ring door alarm in their house. Taking a shower used to be too risky. SJ would see it as an opportunity to leave. "He has been better now that he knows the door alarm is going to go off. He is a bit discouraged because he doesn't like the sound of the bells on the door," explains Pri. Avery also introduced her to AngelSense, a GPS tracking system that helps her locate SJ out in public if he wanders off.

"Avery has been a one-stop shop of resources for me," continues Pri. He coordinated transportation that was covered by her insurance to get SJ to and from therapy. He coordinated respite care so Pri has helpers to watch SJ when she needs to run errands. He even got them annual passes to the Betty Brinn Museum, a Zoo pass, as well as a YMCA membership.

**"I can connect them with different recreational activities for SJ," explains Avery. "They are able to go explore things together so they are not just sitting in the house. It helps with the development of the child and the family overall. The program is a great resource."**

Although not everything is funded by the program, Avery explains there are a lot of resources out there that he has found through his research that he shares with his families. "For example, I found sensory movie theater days, which encourages families to come and just be themselves. If kiddos need to get up and walk around, the other families there are understanding. It is a great time for parents to feel more comfortable, and gives them a chance to connect with other families with the same needs."

"I always recommend CLTS to other parents, because it is full of resources that people don't know are available," adds Pri. "Honestly, when my son was diagnosed, I was lost. I had no idea what to do. So being able to have someone to reach out to with questions and actually get answers... it's like a breath of fresh air. It makes me feel much better. I don't feel so alone."



## WHAT DOES CHILDREN'S LONG-TERM SUPPORT SERVICES OFFER?

Children's Long-Term Support Services provides individualized support for children with physical, developmental or emotional disabilities. Staff members work in partnership with children and families plus other organizations to maximize access to community resources.

# COLLEEN

How Colleen, a client at Curative Adult Day services, starts her day is a metaphor for how she approaches life. “Colleen may arrive at Curative each day in her wheelchair, but she isn’t about to stay in it,” explains Tomorrow, the Adult Day Services program coordinator. “Once she gets here, she gets up out of her chair and walks around. Nothing is going to slow her down. She has so much enthusiasm, it is great to have her here.”

Colleen has been coming to Curative for about six years now. When asked how Adult Day Services has helped Colleen, her mom Kathy would say it has given her a place to be with people her own age with shared interests. “She was 25 years old and was bored hanging out with her folks all the time,” jokes Kathy. “I searched the internet for something that would get her out of the house and we found Curative.”

**“She now prepares her own lunch to take each day,” adds Marc, her dad. “It is great to see how she prepares herself each night for the next day. It is a wonderful skill she has developed because of Curative.”**

“I like that I get to socialize and just hang out with my friends,” explains Colleen. “We do activities like bowling and singing. We talk about the celebrity birthdays of that day. My favorite celebrity is Taylor Swift. I just love her.”

In addition to socialization, Adult Day Services helps clients set goals they would like to work toward. “One of Colleen’s goals is to be a mentor, and she really takes that to heart,” explains Tomorrow. “She likes to help her friends. Colleen even brings her own iPad with her because one of her friends is non-verbal and has a goal to learn to use a computer or iPad to communicate. Colleen sets aside her time to help her friend master these skills. She is a remarkable mentor to others at Adult Day Services. She encourages others with disabilities to do more. It is really great.”

Colleen also takes advantage of all the activities available through Adult Day Services. “She always chooses to go on the outings. She has been to the Milwaukee County Zoo; she will go on the city bus with our staff. She has been to festivals, to Bastille Days,” adds Tomorrow. “She just loves to get out. She is so happy and bubbly, there is never a dull moment with her around.”

“We are so thankful for all Curative has given Colleen. Even our son, Willie, mentioned it,” adds Kathy. “Every week he takes Colleen out for lunch. Before Curative, the conversation used to be more one-sided, but he said to me ‘now Colleen and I really have conversations, it is so nice.’ I love the impact Curative has had on Colleen.” And likewise, the staff at Curative loves the impact Colleen has had on their program.

## WHAT DOES ADULT DAY SERVICES OFFER?

Adult Day Services provides programming at community-based sites in Milwaukee and Waukesha Counties. Programs offer a variety of purposeful, goal-oriented activities and opportunities that promote independence for adults with disabilities. The programs also provide daytime respite for caregivers.

**NOW HIRING: Looking for a dependable employee who is versatile to handle all types of assignments and can be trusted to meet deadlines. Willing to stay at the job for over four decades a plus!**

Not many people have what it takes to fill this “Want Ad” position, but Edna can check all the boxes... and then some.

Following high school, Edna learned about job opportunities at Curative Commercial Services. Fast forward 43 years, and Edna has become one of the most trusted and dependable employees in the Assembly division. Commercial Services at Curative is designed to meet the needs of persons with disabilities develop the skills to be a valued Curative employee or to help them reach their goal of achieving employment in the community.

It means a lot to Edna’s mother, Letitia, that Edna has had the security of a job where she is valued and appreciated.

**“She is very excited about her job,” explains Letitia. “Edna likes to be active and have somewhere to go each day. She likes going to the movies, to get outdoors, and she loves her job at Curative.”**

Her supervisor, Travis, appreciates that Edna is very dependable. “There are usually not too many jobs she cannot work on, so she is very versatile in the jobs and types of work she can do,” explains Travis. “She is one of our ‘go-to’ workers. If we have important jobs and jobs that have strict deadlines, she is one of the workers that we call upon to assist us in accomplishing those tasks.”

In addition to the Assembly Services, Curative Commercial Services also offers Landscape and Maintenance Services. This service line has been a long-standing subcontractor with the Department of Transportation, serving area Park-and-Ride lots, the I-794 freeway and five area Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicle offices. In addition, it provides services to private industries and residential properties in Southeastern Wisconsin.

Letitia appreciates that Curative has connected Edna with a reliable transportation service. “It is even nice that she has access to van transport that can take her to and from work,” adds Letitia. “I used to take her to work all the time, now Edna puts in a reservation with the service and she has a dependable way to get back and forth.”

“Edna has been here so long, it is great to see that even though she has pretty complicated disabilities, it does not hinder her job performance while at work. She has grown to adapt to her challenges and become a very successful employee,” adds Travis. “She interacts with all her coworkers and supervisors. Edna really is loved by everyone here at Curative.”

Curative provides assistance to adults with disabilities or limiting conditions who are interested in paid work opportunities. Curative trains individuals to work on our landscaping crew and at our Commercial Services assembly plant.

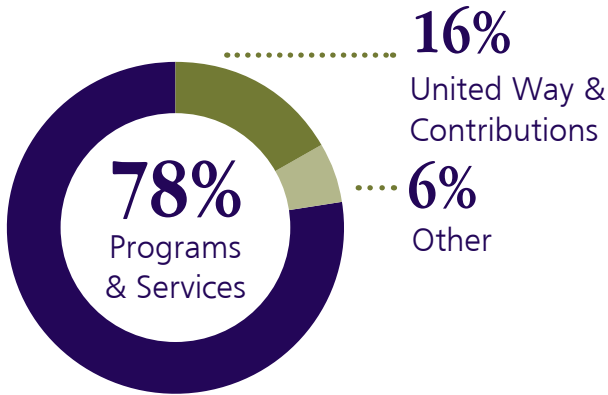

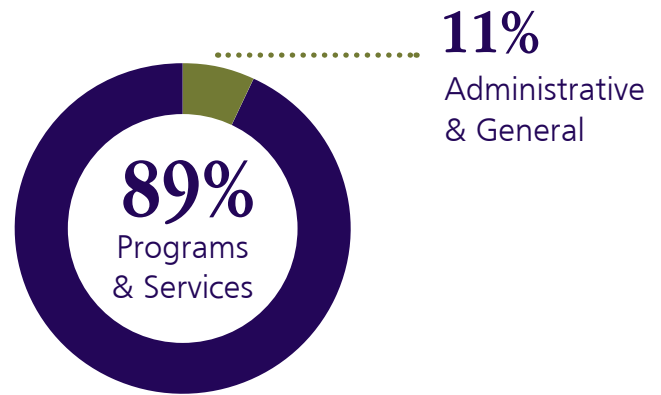
